


“Twenty-One Trends for the 21st Century: Out of the Trenches and into the Future”

What's happening in our world is not just a subtle change but a dramatic reset. Linear thinking may not cut it in a nonlinear, exponentially-changing world. In his most recent groundbreaking book, ***Twenty-One Trends for the 21st Century: Out of the Trenches and into the Future***, author, education leader, and futurist Gary Marx explores massive forces that will have a profound impact on each of us and all of us. He urges anyone who wants things to get back to normal to consider what the new normal will look like. In this presentation, he will explore rapidly changing demographics, constantly emerging technologies, environmental challenges, the way we learn and the way we lead. Rather than simply burning our energy to defend the status quo, he suggests we use it to constantly create a future. (Copies of the book will be available for purchase and signing).

Gary Marx serves as President of the Center for Public Outreach, an organization he founded in 1998, which provides counsel internationally on future-oriented leadership, communication, education, community, and democracy. For 20 years, Mr. Marx was a senior executive for the American Association of School Administrators (AASA). A longtime educator, broadcaster, and community leader, he has served at all levels, from local to global. He was the 2014 President of the honorary Horace Mann League and has been presented the President's Award by the National School Public Relations Association (NSPRA) and the Distinguished Service Award by AASA.

Walking Directions from Metro:

- **Exit the Foggy Bottom Station (Blue/Orange/Silver Lines) and cross 23rd St.**
- **Walk one block east on " I " ('eye') St.**
- **Turn right on 22nd St., and walk approximately 2 blocks south to 'G' Street.**
- **Turn right, and the entrance to The Duques Building is on the right.**

Parking: Parking on campus is a challenge due to construction, so we encourage public transport. On-campus street parking is available, but is limited, and time limits are *strictly enforced*. There is DC parking in the immediate vicinity. Visitors and guests of the GWU Campus may be accommodated at:

- **Academic Center Garage** (on I ('eye') St. between 21st and 22nd Sts.). Open 24/7.
- **Marvin Center** (on H St. between 21st and 22nd Sts.). Open from 7 a.m. til midnight daily.
- **G Street Garage** (entrances on 20th and 21st Sts. in alley way between F and G Sts.). Open 24/7. *[This is a self-service garage, and only accepts MasterCard and Visa for payment]*
- **Rates: 1 hr-\$10 / Up to 2 hrs-\$16 / Even. Max. (5 p.m. til midnight): \$10 Overnight (12am til 2am): \$10**
